

SUMMARY

Amanita strobiliformis (Paulet ex Vittad.) Bertillon in the city of Gdańsk

Amanita strobiliformis (Paulet ex Vittad.) Bertillon (Mycota, Basidiomycetes) is a rare fungus existing mainly in the southern Europe – Mediterranean Sea region. In Poland it was treated as an extinct species so far (category of threat – EX on the Polish red list of large-fructification fungi). A station of this rare species in Słowiński National Park (Czołpino village) was found in 1983. Between 1998-2002 it was found in several places such as Wielkopolska (Poznań city), Lower Silesia (Bialskie and Kaczawskie Mts) and Western Pomerania (Szczecin City). Author of this paper has found two new stands of this species: the first in the park of Technical University of Gdańsk and the second in Radość Valley (Trójmiejski Landscape Park, northern Poland). *A. strobiliformis* should be included to the Polish list of protected large-fructification fungi (macromycetes).
