SUMMARY

New localities of Artemisia eriantha Ten. in the Tatra Mts

Artemisia eriantha Ten. is one of the rarest elements of the Polish flora. In Poland the species has hitherto been recorded from a very few localities limited to the Tatra Mts. In 2002 and 2006 two new localities were discovered in the Polish Tatra in the vicinity of the Morskie Oko Lake: in eastern part of Niżnia Galeria Cubryńska at the altitude of about 1870 m in the Cubryna mountain range over Mały Kocioł Mięguszowiecki, and in the wall of the Kazalnica Mięguszowiecka over Czarny Staw Pod Rysami Lake at the altitude of about 1640 m. *A. eriantha* grows on zone of fragile mylonite rocks at both these localities. They are situated in areas unattractive for tourists or climbers. Therefore, despite the fact that the populations are relatively small they do not seem to be threatened by anthropogenic or natural factors.
