SUMMARY

Puciata R., Ruta R. Localities of *Mycenastrum corium* (Guers.) Desv. near Dziembówko in the Noteć River valley (W Poland) and some remarks on natural value of the Dziembowskie Torfianki

Mycenastrum corium is a rare fungus known in Poland from about 20 localities only. In the present paper three founds on two new localities of this species (53°04′05" N, 16°45′00" E; 53°04′20" N, 16°47′15" E) in the Noteć River valley southeast of Piła are reported. Both localities are situated within the area of the so-called "Dziembowskie Torfianki", a complex of ponds, willow bushes and meadows on the former peat extraction area. It is also a historical locality of *Betula humilis*, and an important refuge for numerous bird species and beaver.
