

SUMMARY

Bartoszek W. A new locality of *Iris sibirica* L. in the Beskid Wyspowy Mts (Western Carpathians, S Poland)

Iris sibirica is one of the rarest species in the flora of Polish part of the Carpathians, strictly protected in Poland. In 2004, it was found at the foot of the Śnieżnica Mt. in Porąbka village (49°43'30" N, 20°12'40" E; EG-01 square of the ATPOL grid) in the vicinity of Dobra near Limanowa. About 20 clusters of Siberian iris occurred there in a patch of wet meadow abundantly overgrown by *Lysimachia vulgaris* and *Sanguisorba officinalis*, in association of such interesting species like: *Carex hartmanii*, *Dactylorhiza majalis*, *Gladiolus imbricatus* and *Primula elatior*.
