

SUMMARY

Nowak A., Nowak S. A new locality of *Eryngium planum* L. in Opole Silesia (SW Poland).

During the floristic studies conducted in 2007 the new site of *Eryngium planum* L., a species threatened in Silesia was found north-west of Lipki village (50°15'49" N, 17°22'28" E; CE16 square of the ATPOL grid). The population of about 150 individuals occupies small area of 50 m² on the Odra river embankments and road verges. *E. planum* grows in a transitional phytocoenosis composed of the species from different syntaxonomical units, mainly *Molinio-Arrhenatheretea* and *Artemisietea vulgaris*. The population is threatened by planned modernization of embankments.
